

*Presently, I'm away taking a post-Easter week of R&R so what follows is a column that first ran in 2015.*

Bill Gates once famously observed, "There will never be a time that personal computers will need more than 512K RAM."

Today's smart phones, held in the palm of one's hand, boast 25 times that amount of memory and more.

Gates' comment took me back to the late 1970s when a seminary classmate showed me his newly minted Radio Shack TRS handheld computer. Awestruck, he held up this little marvel and cooed, "This computer has 4k of memory. That's like... 2,000 words!"

My first computer was an IBM PCjr. It came with 128k of memory. When I upgraded to 256k, I thought I had entered the computer stratosphere.

The memory and capabilities of computers increase with each new incarnation. Yet despite this, or maybe because of it, computers are not enabling us to do less and less but helping fuel our frenzied efforts to do more and more.

In the midst of this technological advance and the ever-increasing momentum of our lives, the ancient words of the Psalmist sound with uncanny power: "Be still and know that I am God" (46:10). Yes, I need to slow down and smell the roses. But the Word of God sounding in these words means so much more than that. That Word means, "Don't be seduced into believing there is an advance, a change, a tweak, or a scheme that is finally going to make everything better. Your life, your opportunity, your moment, is now. And the truths that matter most cannot be reduced to the ever-shrinking dimensions of a microprocessor."

*Be still and know* that God is God. Nothing else, no one else, is. So nothing and no one else can bring the deep, abiding peace that only wells up from the Source (John 4:14; 14:27).

*Be still and savor* the miracle of your life. You don't have tomorrow. You only have today. Love today for the unspeakable gift it is (2 Corinthians 6:2a).

*Be still and know* that your beloved family members and friends are the embodiment and touch, the sinew and skin of God's great love for you" (1 Corinthians 12:21).

*Be still and know* that when all your striving finally ceases, you will fall deftly into the everlasting arms of God. And a rich new chapter of the Mystery at the heart of all things will open to welcome and enfold you (Revelation 21:1-4).

Yes, computers continue to dazzle and amaze but the changes they bring are incremental. True transformation comes not from speeding up but slowing down and "being still," much as a heron stands motionless by the water's edge. Such stillness, when bathed in quiet, attentive trust, gives God room to be God so we don't have to be. That's when "being saved" becomes more than a cliché.

# Music Ministry Transition/Search Process Update

The Music Ministry Transition/Search Committee has identified the following desired outcomes for our work:

- Help the congregation articulate its needs and expectations regarding future music ministry at Knollwood Baptist Church
- Identify larger trends in worship and musical style affecting similar-size congregations in the United States
- Help the congregation develop a leadership profile describing the musical, pastoral, leadership, and interpersonal skills needed in order for the ministry of worship and music to continue to thrive at Knollwood Baptist Church

In order to accomplish this work, we have outlined a three-phase process: Learning, Discerning, and Calling. We are now in the Learning phase. We have identified and are currently interviewing people across the country who can help us identify and understand the larger trends in worship and music in congregations similar to ours. Soon we will be engaging you, the congregation, in conversation, asking you to think with us about the future of the music ministry at Knollwood. These conversations will lead us into the Discerning phase. During this part of the Transition/Search process, the committee will distill all that we have learned into a staffing model and music ministry leadership profile which, when complete, we will bring to the congregation. With a music and worship leadership model in place, we will begin the Calling phase, when we will actively look for the person we believe God is calling to serve in this important role.

We want and need your prayers and your engagement in this work. We welcome your questions and support. We are excited about what will be next for music and worship at Knollwood Baptist Church.



On Palm Sunday, Knollwood dedicated a new room set aside specifically for prayer and contemplation. Together, the congregation prayed that it would be a space:

## The Importance of Connection

1 in 5 US children under 18, or 16 million children, live in poverty. (US Census Bureau) According to the United Way of Forsyth County, 1 in 3 children under the age of 18 in our area are living in poverty.

Read that last sentence again and reflect on it for a moment. How do these statistics affect our students? What can we do to make a difference?

Eric Jensen, noted author of brain research, has identified seven differences between students from low income households and their peers in terms of classroom engagement: Health and Nutrition, Vocabulary, Effort, Hope and Growth Mindset, Cognition, Relationships, and Distress. (Educational Leadership, May, 2013.) He suggests ways that teachers can understand and address these differences in their students, but he underscores that unless they take the time to get to know their students first, to make a connection with them, his advice will mean little.

Knollwood volunteers attempt to make a connection with low income students in a variety of programs. KBC volunteers partner on Tuesdays with St. Paul's Episcopal Church at Kids Café. Students come to St. Paul's for a nutritious, hot meal and one-on-one homework assistance three nights a week. During this time, homework is completed, but more important, relationships have blossomed. Tutors encourage, explain, console, and often admit to students that learning how to do something in a new way can be difficult. This admission often results in laughter, strengthening the relationship with the student. Tutors grow in their awareness of the needs of the students.

At Bolton Elementary School, Bolton Buddies connect with students through one-on-one tutoring, teaching the Augustine Literacy program, coaching the Battle of the Books team, leading a Boys' Read group, and providing Book Teasers to encourage reading. Behind the scenes, volunteers pack, transport, and distribute Backpack food and work in the Media Center. These opportunities have created strong relationships between Bolton students and some of their families and another caring adult in the community.

Knollwood partners with the Literacy Program of the YMCA in ESL classes at The Ledges Apartment Complex. While moms improve their English skills, children have a safe place to play and explore while also being exposed to vocabulary and new experiences under the supervision of Knollwood volunteers. This early intervention will pay dividends as these toddlers enter school.

It has often been said that education is the key to alleviating poverty. School alone cannot overcome this issue. Making connections and relationships with these families lays the foundation for making improvement in the students' ability to thrive in the classroom. Do you have time to make a connection? We have a place for you.
