Taking a Look at the Family Finances

Every family has to find a way to manage its finances, making sure income matches, or surpasses, outgo.

When expenses are higher than income, there are two basic options: reduce expenses or increase income. When facing such a challenge, most of us begin by reducing expenses. Maybe we cut back on eating out or we install a TV antenna and cut cable.

But when expenses are consistently greater than income, even after making needed adjustments, the family must find a way to bring in more dollars. Maybe a family member finds a better job or starts a business on the side. But somehow, income must be increased.

Our church family is no different.

The financial generosity of many members of the Knollwood family is striking and inspiring. Such generosity made it possible to renovate our entire campus and build the Wellness and Community Center, and all while funding an ambitious ministry plan (a.k.a, the “annual church budget”) each year. Given such sacrificial giving on the part of so many in our church family, it is not surprising that giving to the annual budget has been flat for the last couple of years.

However, we are now at that place most families face, from time-to-time, where there are no more easy cuts in expenses. If we want the Kingdom work God has entrusted to us to thrive and grow, we must increase giving to our annual ministry plan. Such financial gifts are essential if we are to fulfill our church’s mission: *Learning to Love and Live like Jesus with Head, Hearts, and Hands*.

By giving to our church’s mission, one helps provide the resources to teach our children to know, love, sing, and live the story of Jesus; one helps provide a vital youth ministry where adolescents can ask hard questions about faith and life; one helps provide spiritual formation, growth, and service opportunities for adults of all ages; one helps provide weekly services of worship that comfort and challenge, engage and inspire; one helps provide missional initiatives in our community such as assisting with refugee resettlement, offering a Food Panty for Bolton school families, and mentoring at-risk students.

And as further expression of Knollwood’s generosity, our church practices tithing, or giving 10% of income, to ministry partners *beyond* our local congregation. These ministry partners include faith-based service providers such as Crisis Control, Habitat for Humanity, and the Second Harvest Food Bank.

There is so much to celebrate and give thanks for in the life and witness of our church. And so many people to thank for the financial and human resources that make it all possible.

But now we need others to join in the incredible privilege of giving more, and giving more regularly, to the Kingdom enterprise we call Knollwood Baptist Church. For that is the only way we can rise to the high calling of doing the Kingdom work Jesus is counting on us, and no one else, to do.

- Music education for all ages is an important value for our church to continue.
- We respect our rich tradition of meaningful music in worship and are open to continuing our practice of exploring music that reflects the richness and diversity of God's creation.

Essential qualifications of our music minister:

- Both a pastor and a music leader with training in both music and theology
- Skilled in music education for all ages
- Demonstrates a strong commitment to living like Jesus and who shares Knollwood's vision and mission.

This month the committee will begin publicizing our open position among trusted leaders in music ministry and in professional sacred music organizations. Recommended candidates will submit both detailed letters of interest and recommendation for the committee to review. Interviews of qualified candidates will follow.

The committee members ask for your support and prayer as we move into the search phase of our work.

KBC Online Directory Resource

When the phone rings in the KBC office there is a good chance it is a member looking for an address or phone number. Many have asked, "When are we going to do another directory?" Well, Christmas is coming early to KBC this year. You now have the opportunity to utilize ShelbyNext on your computer, smart phone, tablet or any other way you access the Internet, to get the information you want and need. Instead of a printed directory, we now have an electronic portal to access information.

ShelbyNext is the Church Management Software system KBC uses to track membership, giving, attendance, and financial information. With recent upgrades, you now have the ability to sign on to your personal ShelbyNext account, look up phone numbers and addresses of others, update your contact information, see your attendance and giving records, and give online.

To request access to your personal ShelbyNext account please email marlin@knollwood.org, or call the church office at 336-725-1343 and let us know that you would like to be added to ShelbyNext. You will receive an email with login credentials. Of course, as with many gifts there is some assembly required. In order to install the ShelbyNext App on your mobile device, look in the Google or Apple store for ShelbyNext. Your individual login credentials are yours alone. Please do not share your personal login information with others unless you want them to see your attendance and giving records.

For those who do not wish to use your online account you can always call the office to request information or to ask for an in-house printed directory.

Faith Formation Learning Goals: A Lifelong Continuum


On Sept. 30, at a gathering of Knollwood Sunday School teachers, children’s worship leaders, youth mentors, and adult small group leaders, Diane Lipsett, Chrissy Hardy, and Josh Godwin presented a newly revised description of Knollwood’s “Faith Formation Learning Goals.” Addressing faith development from children through youth into adulthood, the document articulates learning goals in five areas:

- Formation – Spiritual and Ethical
- Worship and Church Life
- Bible Knowledge and Interpretation
- Theology and Religious Thought
- Missions, Service, and Outreach

This work has a good history. Between 2006 and 2012, a group called the Christian Studies Team under the leadership of Dr. Kenneth J. Meyers, then Minister of Christian Formation, worked intently to formulate Knollwood’s learning goals along a lifelong continuum. Exceptional collaborative work aimed to generate “a comprehensive canopy over the Christian education ministry at Knollwood.”

The current document revises, streamlines, and updates that earlier work, weaving in more recent congregational commitments. These lifelong learning goals describe a long arc of faith formation experiences at Knollwood Baptist Church. We hope the document will orient teachers, small group leaders, ministers, mentors, and others toward shared faith formation ministry. We hope these goals help us evaluate where we’ve been, what we’re doing, and where we’re going. Moreover, we believe this statement of our faith formation goals helps communicate what our particular faith community values and offers in the vibrant, complex, lifelong process of being and becoming disciples of Jesus.

As we braced ourselves for a hurricane recently, schools were cancelled two days before we saw a single raindrop in the Triad. Though we were closely following the news and hurting for our Eastern N.C. neighbors, parents of young children were also having to

adjust plans to figure out childcare on two days in September when school is usually in session. The WCC came in handy.



On both days, we had more than 30 children and their parents gather in the Community Room to eat a bag lunch, play games and run amuck in the gym, and create "hurricane lanterns" in the Arts and Hearts room with tissue paper, sequins and LED candles. A few moms huddled in the corner,

working on laptops and trying to meet work deadlines that weren't budging for the weather. Other parents helped supervise in the gym and still more were sweeping sequins off the floor and wiping up spilled glue. A grandmother got down

on the floor and joined some young children for an episode of Cosmic Kids Yoga. There were happy Knollwood children, several neighborhood friends and visitors, a few of our (not so recently) resettled families from Syria, and a whole lot of noise.

We were happy to have a place to go and people to be with. It's a nice image of what community is like. We were truly a village; taking turns parenting other people's children and bemoaning the inconvenience of cancelled school while counting our blessings that we had electricity and friendship. Some of our children's ministry events are planned out a year in advance and others happen at the spur of the moment like these. But they all have one thing in common – we are a great big family. I am looking forward to our Family Retreat at Camp Merriwood in October. We will gather again for games and crafts and learning and worship. It will last more than just two hours, but I'm praying it has the same spirit that our hurricane parties did – many families coming together to connect as a family of God.

I. Financial Gifts

Our Missions Allocations and Affiliation Committee (MAAC) has sent an initial gift of \$10,000 to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina (CBF, NC). CBF/NC will be channeling all such funds through local churches in the devastated areas. These churches are positioned to assess needs and respond most effectively to the crises in their communities.

II. Volunteer Service

We are currently working with the "Baptists on Mission" to identify an area in which a team of Knollwood folks can assist in the Florence relief effort. We are hopeful to schedule a Saturday in the near future to travel to the eastern part of our state for a day of volunteer work. Since Florence relief and rebuilding will be a months—if not years—long cleanup effort, we will also look for more robust service opportunity for the spring or summer.
