

ABOUT OUR BANNERS

The Easter banner views Jesus' resurrection from the inside of the tomb looking out. The grave clothes reflect the note in John 20:7 that the burial linens were left in the tomb with the head wrapping separate from the rest. The contrasting darkness within the tomb and the brightness outside point to the light of God's new day breaking upon a "new creation" (2 Corinthians 5:17). As Jesus exits the tomb, clothed in a loin cloth, he is about to surprise Mary with the realization, "The Lord is risen! The Lord is risen indeed!" (John 20:18). The artist who painted the banner is our own Bambi Setzer.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT PROGRAMS

April 12: *A Tale of Two Journeys*

Calling all Moravian history buffs, friends of Salem Academy and College, and anyone who loves to hear about remarkable achievements!

Join us for *A Tale of Two Journeys*, a story about two fascinating 500-mile walks, 255 years apart. We will learn about the incredible 1766 migration from Bethlehem to Bethabara, taken on foot and wagons through the backwoods by eighteen young women, accompanied by only two men. This brave group of eighteen became the backbone of the Single Sisters and Older Girls' Choirs in Bethabara and Salem. One of these intrepid girls would become the first teacher of the Little Girls' School which started in 1772 and evolved into the Salem Academy and College we know today.

And just as remarkable, we'll hear about the month-long, 500-mile reenactment of that journey, taken entirely on foot in the fall of 2021. Both journeys bear witness to the value early Moravians, and all those who have inherited Salem's legacy, have placed on educating women and girls.
